Overview of CME on OvidMD


- Utilizing personalization features, physicians have the ability to obtain continuing medical education credits (AMA PRA Category 1 Credit™) for improving the outcome of patient care through researching a clinical topic in OvidMD.
- Physicians can also refer back to certificates received by creating or viewing their personal account to see the history which provides the date received, clinical topic researched, copy of certificate and completed question set.

Overview of CME on OvidMD

Personalization features allow your users to:

- Save searches as well as set-up alerts when new content related to their search is added. They can also save articles, email colleagues, and even export images to PowerPoint.
- Earn and track CME through researching a clinical topic on OvidMD
- Each search can earn 0.5 AMA PRA Category 1 Credit
